



Lindley CE Infant School Anti-Litter Policy

Article 24 UNCRC charter

All members of the school community have the right to a clean environment but they also have a responsibility to do what they can to look after their environment.

What is litter?

Litter can be described as 'rubbish that is in the wrong place'.

We aim to have:

- A school that respects and cares for the school, community and global environment.
- A litter free school and a clean and tidy local environment.
- We will try to recycle or reuse wherever possible.
- We will eat **all** our fruit snack outside and compost the fruit waste.
- *Do not waste fruit by taking one bite then throwing it away*

All members of the school community need to:

- To put their litter in a bin or take it home.
- Not to drop litter.
- To pick up litter which is lying around, inside the building or in the school grounds.
- To help the caretaker to pick up litter from the school grounds each morning.
- Hold special litter picking days to 'Keep Lindley Tidy'.

Staff have a collective responsibility to:

- To use the recycling bins for all waste paper.
- To teach children how to prevent litter.

School Council has a responsibility :

- To listen to and suggest ideas for keeping the school and its grounds litter-free.
- Decide where we need bins in the school grounds.

The governing body has a responsibility to:

Ensure the school grounds are kept litter-free and monitor the effectiveness of the school policy.
