



Lindley CE Infant School Fairtrade Policy

Lindley CE Infant School is committed to supporting Fairtrade wherever possible. Fairtrade is about guaranteeing a better deal for producers in developing countries.

The children say *"We want all primary school children to be able to go to school, buying Fairtrade can help"*

In particular the school will:

- Support the Fairtrade Steering Group / Enterprise Group
- Ensure that Fairtrade is part of the School Development Plan
- Use Fairtrade products wherever possible:
tea, coffee and sugar in the staff room, at meetings, coffee afternoons and in classroom cooking activities
Plan 'Breakfast sessions' to incorporate Fairtrade products.
- Investigate the sourcing of the daily fruit delivery
- Explore the possibility of using Fairtrade sports balls in school
- Explore using uniforms made with Fairtrade cotton
- Ensure Fairtrade products are available wherever possible. For example, at events in the school or the community
- Ensure learning about Fairtrade happens in a range of lessons and in whole school activities
- Promote Fairtrade within the school and wider community, particularly during Fairtrade Fortnight.
